February 23, 7pm Plum Island Louise Harrison



The President's Corner Jill Vomacka

Happy Holidays NSAS members! I want to introduce myself to you all. My name is Jill Vomacka and I have been a NSAS board member for ten years. I got interested in bird watching and found that NSAS offered some wonderful evening programs. I started attending the board meetings because I could not get to the regular Tuesday general membership program meetings. After a year I was able to switch my schedule and found time for the general meeting programs as well. I assisted in the 60th anniversary of the NSAS luncheon and later was assigned co-program coordinator. I slowly offered to run for Vice president and then President. So here I am after 10 years. Looking forward to eventually seeing everyone in person...but until then please join us in our Zoom programs. Information on how to join us on Zoom is in the newsletter or our website.

One of my main focuses has been beach nesting birds, like the endangered Piping Plover and threatened Least Terns. I have volunteered for the "Be a Good Egg" program, explaining to beach goers their impact on nesting birds in addition to monitoring a local beach. 2020 wasn't just a rough year for humans, but a tough year for beach nesting birds due to overuse of beaches by people craving a release from quarantine.

This past spring and summer was quite hard for the piping plovers and least terns who were trying to nest at Stehli Beach in Bayville. Piping Plovers were a few weeks late in arriving in late March. The weather was hot and the general population was out and about getting fresh air wherever they could. They arrived at the beaches by the droves this year due to the pandemic. Unfortunately, they also brought their dogs and allowed them off leash. The imaginary string barrier was not in place until June, due to pandemic issues and people and dogs were getting too close to the piping plover nests. They were abandoned for a short while but did come back after the string was put up with signs about the nesting endangered birds. I did speak to the

Oyster Bay Enforcement Code Patrol, and things did get a little better, however I do not know if the Piping Plover chicks ever fledged. The Least Terns arrived in late June, early July. I did not see but a few chicks, again I do not know if they fledged. It was not a banner year for these two species at Stehli Beach. At Center Island Beach I did not see one Piping Plover or Least Tern at all this year. This beach in the past has 2 to 3 Piping Plover nests and 3-5 chicks make it to fledging. I hope it gets better for these two species next year.

In addition to our Zoom membership meetings, I have found some Zoom programs from different Festivals that have gone viral. In addition check out what Audubon is offering and all the cam recorders that have been set up of live bird activity.

How to use ebird to find rare birds and local hotspots.

Ebird.org from Cornell Lab of Ornithology is free to join. Set up a membership and load the app on your phone if you wish to list birds while on walks. If you only want to see what's new and interesting, on the website, go to Explore, Regions, and enter Nassau NY (not Nassau FL) On the right, you'll see Recent Visits. Click on More Recent Visits and it will bring up all the lists submitted within the last day or so, which you can click on to view individual lists. If you go to ebird.org/alerts you can subscribe to daily emails for rare birds or birds you have not seen this year for each region you choose. Ebird has many tutorials on how to use the app and website. Most of our field notes are on ebird and this year's Christmas Count will be recorded on ebird. Once you get started you'll find it's a valuable tool to enhance your birding experiences.


